City Wide Yard Sale—September 7th—9th

- Set up Thursday Sept 6th, 6pm—10pm. No sales allowed during set up.
- Sales allowed 7 am—8 pm on each day of the event.
- No permit will be needed for Jacksonville residents who sell from their own property within the city limits or for Jacksonville businesses with a current business license selling at their location.
- All others require a City Wide Yard Sale / Vendor Permit which is a cost of \$10 per day. Permits can be purchased at the City office no later than September 5th at 3:00 pm.
- All food vendors must meet requirements set forth by Jackson County and obtain a City Wide Yard Sale / Vendor Permit which is a cost of \$10 per day.

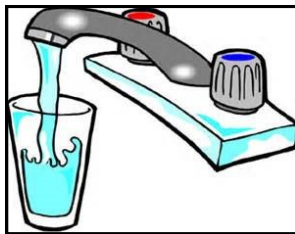

Jackson County Health & Human Services recently conducted a survey of the City of Jacksonville water system. The primary purpose of the water system survey is to evaluate the entire water system in terms of supplying safe drinking water. *DWS has established criteria for determining whether a system should be considered to have "outstanding performance."*



The Jacksonville water system met the established criteria of outstanding performance! We are ecstatic to have received this designation. There are only a handful of cities in the state that have met the criteria of outstanding performance!
