The application before HARC shall be evaluated using criteria contained in Title 18 of the Jacksonville Municipal Code, specifically 18.05.040, 18.10, 18.11, 18.18.020, and other relevant sections of the unified Development Code. Please address any comments to these criteria. All oral, written, drawn or photographic evidence must be directed toward comprehensive plan criteria, or land use regulations and objective standards. Failure to raise an issue through oral, written, drawn, or photographic illustration with sufficient specificity to afford the decision-maker and the affected parties an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes appeal to the City Council on the issue.

All applications to be considered are Limited Land Use decisions as defined by ORS 197.015 and are subject to the provisions of ORS 197.195.
