The CAC looked at our current Solar Standards which are very complicated to work with for both staff and residents, also there is a typo in the formula which makes no sense. Do we want to let residents create shade on neighboring properties? Should we do away with Solar standards all together? Our Solar standards apply to every structure within City limits. There currently is a variance procedure which entails obtaining a Solar Waiver from your neighbors, that is later recorded with your property's deed.

We may keep the Solar Standards and provide a much better document. We looked at the City of Ashland's Solar Standards, and theirs are as complicated as our current document is. Staff may see about reaching out to Nikki at Green Top Planning to assist us in creating a software that would help staff and residents identify the Solar shadow casting on each property.
