The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022 as approved by the CITY OF JACKSONVILLE Budget Committee. This budget is for an annual budget period. This budget was prepared on a basis of accounting that is the same as the preceding year.

Keeping Natural Watercourses Clean

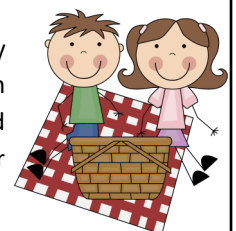
This is a yearly reminder of your responsibility to keep the natural watercourse through your property cleaned of debris and any obstructions that might affect water flow and water quality. Limbs, logs, "woody" vines (such as blackberries and brambles) and debris should be removed if they are causing an impassable area where debris could dam up. Natural grasses/perennial weeds that grow low to the ground should remain, as they are helpful in trapping sediments and preventing erosion. In order to help improve water quality in our streams, please do not dump grass clippings or leaves into the waterway. Keep chemicals away from the stream area and keep run-off into the stream at a minimum. Any impromptu footbridges or planks are discouraged because they may cause a dam in a high-water event.



Reminder - To protect Oregon's fish and wildlife resources, date guidelines for in-water work is from June 15th – August 31st. Creek cleaning is not allowed after Sept. 1st. Thank you for your help in keeping our watercourses healthy.

May 3, 2022—City Council

- **Resolution No. R2022-003 A Resolution Approving an Intergovernmental Agreement for a Coordinated Water Rights Management and Water Sharing Plan and Authorizing City Administrator to Execute Same.** Resolution No. R2022-003 for the Intergovernmental Agreement was approved.
- **Historic Jacksonville Facility Use Permit Annual Report.** Carolyn Kingsnorth gives Council the annual report of activities for the Beekman House and Beekman Bank. Council thanks Carolyn for her efforts through Historic Jacksonville, Inc., in keeping the historic charm of Jacksonville.
- **Brunner Building Lease.** The Brunner Building lease to the Jacksonville Senior Center, Inc. was renewed for three years.
- **Event Permit—July Fourth Mayor’s Picnic.** Council approved the event permit for the July Fourth Mayor’s Picnic on New City Hall lawn.
- **Memorandum of Understanding for Jacksonville with the Jacksonville Woodlands Association—Forest Park.** Council approved the Memorandum of Understanding with the JWA for the Forest Park.
- **Resolution No. R2022-002 A Resolution Accepting the Appointments of the Budget Committee for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget Cycle.** State Budget Law requires the City to appoint members to the Budget Committee by resolution each fiscal year. Council approved Resolution No. R2022-002 accepting the appointments to the Budget Committee for FY 2022-2023. Budget Committee members are: Donna Bowen, Jim Lewis, Mike McClain, Scott Selbe, Ken Gregg, Andrea Thompson, Steve Casaleggio, Larry Smith, Brad Bennington, Susan Taylor, Mark Thomas, Paul Veenhof, Eric Rogers and Ryan Hess.

May 17, 2022—City Council

- **Notice of Appeal—Set Public Hearing Date and Time.** Council set a public hearing date of June 7, 2022 for an appeal received on a conditionally approved Certificate of Appropriateness Application for a new single-family dwelling on a vacant parcel located at 584 South Loop Road.
- **Approval of Yellow Flags for Art Walk.** Council approved the hanging of flags at each business participating in the Art Walk.

May 17, 2022—Work Session

- **Museum Research Update.** Councilor Gregg gave an update on the research for a potential museum in the City of Jacksonville. This will come before Council on an agenda in the future to start working on possible scenarios.
- **Transient Lodging Tax Revenue.** Staff and Council discussed the disposition of Transient Lodging Tax Revenue as it relates to the Visitors Information Center.
- **Visitor Information Center Management Agreement.** The Management Agreement with the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce for the operation of the Visitors Center expires in June 2022 and will be going before Council for discussion on renewal.
- **Urban Renewal Update / Process.** Staff updated Council on the process for the Urban Renewal Plan Amendment.
