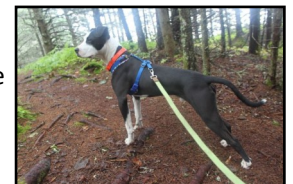

The City has received several complaints recently about dogs off leash on the walking trails in Jacksonville. This is just a reminder that this is NOT allowed per city ordinance and if cited a person could be fined up to \$1000 per offense.

as some people are terrified of dogs. If you feel that your dog must run free, the city has designated the Forest Park at the end of Jackson Creek Reservoir Rd as such an area.

I will be directing patrol officers to focus a little more time on the trails system in an effort to gain compliance. As a part of this effort you will be seeing a motor officer on the trails in the coming months thanks to the generous donation of a fully equipped police bike from the Medford Police Department.

In closing, I hope that those that use our trail system will self police. It is not my desire to have to issue citations to curb this behavior. Please be respectful of all users of the trail system.

Fire Reduction Efforts in the Woodlands



The objective of fuel reduction is to create a safer, more manageable forest surrounding Jacksonville. By reducing fuel loads, we decrease the chance of wildfires climbing into the canopy (tree crowns) to further destroy forests, other natural resources, homes, and lives. For far too long, prescribed fire burns have been a tool to be feared, not revered and valued in its ability to restore our forests to the mottled, more resilient resource we can better manage.

The City will be entering in to a contract with Grayback Forestry to burn 7 acres adjacent to Timber Ridge Estates in the Fall or early Spring as well as 12 acres of Manzanita and Ceanothus on the east slope below Panorama Point.

June 18, 2019—City Council

- **Fire Reduction Efforts in the Jacksonville Woodlands.** Bob Budesca and Chris Johnson speak to Council regarding the onsite meeting with interested citizens and the communications with Grayback Forestry for fire reduction efforts this fall.
