The Jacksonville Woodlands Association (JWA) is a non-profit organization founded in 1989. The Association's mission is to acquire and preserve scenic wooded hillsides and historic open spaces in and around the City of Jacksonville to protect and preserve the land as a natural resource. The Jacksonville Woodlands Historic Natural Park & Trail System is the Association's most extensive undertaking. This land conservation effort protects 255 acres of woodlands habitat interconnected by 16 miles of hiking trails. Trailside educational displays, wild flower brochures and trail maps have been developed to help enrich the visitor experience. Habitat protection and stewardship of the natural resource land are also part of the Association's mission.

Take a Hike – Woodland Trails

- Sarah Zigler Interpretive Trail - 0.75 miles
- Rich Gulch Trail to Panorama Point – 1 mile
- Rich Gulch Trail to Petard Ditch Loop – 1 mile
Petard Ditch Loop – 1.4 miles
Add Liz's Trail Loop - 1.5 miles
- Beekman Loop – 1 mile
(Loop trails - Moderate Elevation Gain)

Jacksonville Woodlands History Loop – Peter Britt Gardens to Beekman House – about 4.0 miles

Begin at the Peter Britt Gardens/Sarah Zigler Trail Head (Britt Festivals)

- Please leash your dog and pick up waste. Use dog poop stations located at major trailheads.
- Please stay on trails – Poison Oak is active year-round.
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited.
- Bicycles are welcome but are discouraged during wet weather conditions.
- Please do not disturb the natural or historic features.
- Picking or collecting of plants or wild flowers is prohibited.
- Fires, smoking, camping, hunting or gold mining are prohibited.
- Wear comfortable shoes while hiking and take along water.
